

NTPC Health & Safety Alert

Incident Summary – November 2020



Background

The following incidents were reported in November 2020. Medium and High Reasonable Potential for Harm (RPH) incidents are covered in more detail in separate alerts.

Practical Guidance

11-06-20, Fort Liard, NTPC Incident, Low RPH

- Event: 15 L of propylene glycol leaked from a pressure relief valve on the school heating system, spill contained to cement floor.
- Response: Spill cleaned up and reported.

11-10-20, Fort Liard, Public Incident, Low RPH

- Event: 3rd party contractor damaged guy wire with loader while backing up.
- Response: Guy wire to be repaired.

11-17-20, Taltson, Contractor Incident, Low RPH

- Event: While driving the side-by-side's passenger door swung open and damaged the door's plastic window.
- Response: Incident discussed during Tailboard Meeting.

11-17-20, Paulatuk, NTPC Incident, Low RPH

- Event: Drive belt damaged after starting truck left outside during a blizzard.
- Response: Truck moved to the garage, drive belt to be replaced. Truck to be parked in garage during blizzards.

11-24-20, Snare, NTPC Incident, Low RPH

- Event: Vehicle slid into ditch at km 20 on an ice patch formed from runoff.
- Response: Ice path sanded, graded and marked with traffic cones. Workers warned of icy spot at daily meeting, signs to be posted warning of ice.

11-29-20, Snare, Contractor Incident, Low RPH

- Event: Contractor brushing crew complained of fatigue, work materials appear to have been deliberately damaged at the worksite.
- Response: Incident and performance expectations discussed with workgroup. Workers removed from site for temporary rest days, additional periodic rest days scheduled for remainder of project.
